A Message from Harold & Carole Albert



Perry & Margie Pintzow are now being honored not just for their philanthropy. As a young family they have a long and outstanding record of community involvement - working together and individually to strengthen our Jewish community and the community at large. Since moving to Albuquerque in 2003, they have immersed themselves in communal life.

Margie had obtained a master's degree in education from Georgia State University. When she became aware of the Solomon Schechter Hebrew Day School, she immediately offered her education and skills as a volunteer. This led to her subsequently serving on its board of directors, followed by her election to president. During her time with Schechter, the school thrived. She is a strong advocate for Jewish education and was instrumental in changing the name of Schechter to the "Jewish Academy of Arts and Sciences". As early as 2006, Margie served on the JCC board of directors and its numerous committees. She co-sponsored the JCC program entitled "Tikkun Olam", which means "to repair the world". The objective was to outreach to the community with services and visits to shelters providing food and programs.

Perry from an early age was involved with Jewish programs and organizations. In high school Perry joined AZA, the B'nai Brith Jewish youth organization. That piqued his interest in leadership within a community as AZA was a source for social events, community service projects, athletic tournaments, and Jewish programming. In college he joined the AEPi Jewish Fraternity. The mission of AEPi is developing leadership for the Jewish Community. Subsequently he has volunteered for Super Sunday raising significant funds for Jewish causes. As a strong financial supporter of our JCC, Perry has also contributed his expertise and his software company to providing our JCC with our website and our data base.

Together they have been extremely involved with Locker 505 which assists children in need. Not only have they raised considerable monies for Locker 505, but they have served on its board of directors and Margie serves as its president.


Many of us have worried about the future of Judaism in New Mexico with the loss of communal organizations. However, we are thrilled with the continued success of our thriving JCC.

There is a saying in Judaism, L'dor v'dor which literally means from generation to generation. Margie and Perry Pintzow have devoted their
lives to bettering the Greater Albuquerque
Community.

Caring for their community is an instinct instilled by the generations before them and guides their internal compass. They have selflessly lent a helping hand to countless strangers, friends, and neighbors when they had nowhere left to turn. Their volunteered time and resources have been greatly appreciated by the Jewish community and Greater Albuquerque Community as a whole.

Margie Pintzow has served as the Board President of the former Schechter Day School where she raised thousands of dollars to support tuition scholarships for students and was honored as a Woman of Valor for her contributions.

Both Margie and Perry's passion to help children in need led them to Locker 505 where Margie currently serves as the Board President. Seeing a need for expansion to accommodate more children, Perry found and purchased Locker 505's current location. Over the last year, Locker 505 has doubled the number of children they assist and is able to provide additional help for students.

Through Margie and Perry's leadership, Locker 505 has been allocated additional grants to provide students with clothing items and shoes along with other essentials.





Diana Trujeque

2023 Humanitarian Award Recipient



or the past 38 years, Diana Trujeque has dedicated her life to helping New Mexico's children and their families cope with the day-to-day educational, emotional and financial needs of living with and fighting cancer, first as a board member, and for the past eleven years as the Executive Director of the Children's Cancer Fund of

New Mexico, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization established in 1972.

In 1984 her son Erin, a champion junior golfer, was diagnosed with cancer. He passed in 1985. Before his death, friends wanted to hold a golf tournament to help his family. Erin said it was okay if it was "for all the kids," not just him.

In 1986, Trujeque, along with her friends and family, started that Golf Tournament to raise money for the Children's Cancer Fund and raised \$22,000. Now in its 38th year, the Erin Trujeque Memorial Golf Tournament has raised over \$10 million for the Children's Cancer Fund of New Mexico.

In 1999, Trujeque along with the board of Children's Cancer Fund developed a college scholarship program for teens who have been in treatment at the University of New Mexico Cancer Center. diagnosed with and treated for childhood cancer in New Mexico. Under her leadership, the fund now raises \$180,000 to \$200,000 each year to pay for eight semesters of undergraduate or 4 and four semesters of graduate tuition at the UNM rate to any school. In 2021 to 2022, thirty-two scholarships were awarded to students benefiting from the Children's Cancer Fund.

Trujeque has created programs, raised funds, and built a network of donors across New Mexico to garner support and awareness for the Fund. She directed the fundraising for the construction and implementation of Erin's Place, a Hospice facility on the UNM campus. Erin's Place provides a homelike atmosphere for children who are facing end of live as an alternative to remaining in the hospital.



Dr. Sanjeev Arora


2023 Humanitarian Award Recipient

r. Sanjeev Arora is the founder of Project ECHO and the Executive Director of the ECHO Institute. He is a tenured professor of medicine in the Department of Internal Medicine at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center. Dr. Arora launched Project ECHO at the University of New Mexico in 2003 as a solution for helping all patients receive quality care faster. The ECHO model works by strengthening the capacity of rural primary care providers to treat complex conditions locally with ongoing remote support from an interdisciplinary team of experts and a community of peers.

Dr. Arora's idea for Project ECHO derived from his personal experience as a liver disease specialist practicing in New Mexico where patients endured an eight-month waitlist for appointments and often drove hundreds of miles per visit. Project ECHO uses videoconferencing technology to implement a "hub-and-spoke" model for training New Mexico's community-based clinicians in rural counties, Indian Health Service clinics, and state prisons to treat patients where they live.

The ECHO model is being applied around the world with programs in North America, Latin America, Europe, Africa, Australia, and Asia and partnerships with the World Health Organization and the Center for Disease Control. Dr. Arora has been a pioneer in democratizing specialized medical knowledge to be






inclusive of rural communities with little access to specialized medicine. In 2007, Project ECHO won the Ashoka Foundation's Changemakers award, an international competition recognizing programs that are changing the paradigm of how medicine is practiced.

Dr. Arora has served as the Director of the ECHO institute since its establishment and has previously served as Executive Vice-Chair and Acting Chair of the Department of Internal Medicine, President of the Medical Staff, and for five years served on the Board of the Health Sciences Center at the University of New Mexico.

Clara Apodaca

2023 Humanitarian Award Recipient



ormer First Lady of New Mexico (1975-1978), Clara Apodaca has spent her career serving the constituents of New Mexico. Apodaca is the former President and CEO of the National Hispanic Cultural Center Foundation, a patron of the arts, and chair of her son's foundation, the Jeff Apodaca Celebration of Life Foundation, which funded the new Multimedia Center at UNM Children's Hospital. Selected for 100 influentials by Hispanic Business Magazine in October 2008, Apodaca was named "Power Broker" by the New Mexico Business Weekly. She currently serves on the Board of Directors of Think New Mexico, the International Women's Forum and Opera Southwest.

From 1989 to 1993, Apodaca was the General Assistant to the Chairman of the Democratic National Committee. She also served as Cabinet Secretary for the New Mexico Office of Cultural Affairs under two governors. From 1993 to 2001, Apodaca served in the Clinton Administration in Washington, DC. While in DC, she also served as Commissioner on the DC Commission of the Arts & Humanities and was appointed the White House Millennium Commission by former First Lady Hillary Clinton. Apodaca received the 2010 New Mexico Spirit of Achievement Award from the National Jewish Health for community service. She was also honored by the Wheels Museum at their annual gala in 2015. Apodaca received the New Mexico First's Lifetime Achievement Award and also received the 2010 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Albuquerque Hispano Chamber of Commerce.


